Benefits of the 24/7 Sobriety Program:

- Lower bond
- Remain in society
- Continue to work
- Remain involved in family life

How PBT Works:

Participants must submit to twice daily preliminary breath tests (PBT) between the morning and evening hours of operation. Participants are required to submit to testing 7 days a week while on the Program. Participants are required to pay at the time of testing, or pay in advance.

#### How Drug Testing Works:

24/7 uses two methods of to test for a variety of illegal drug use:

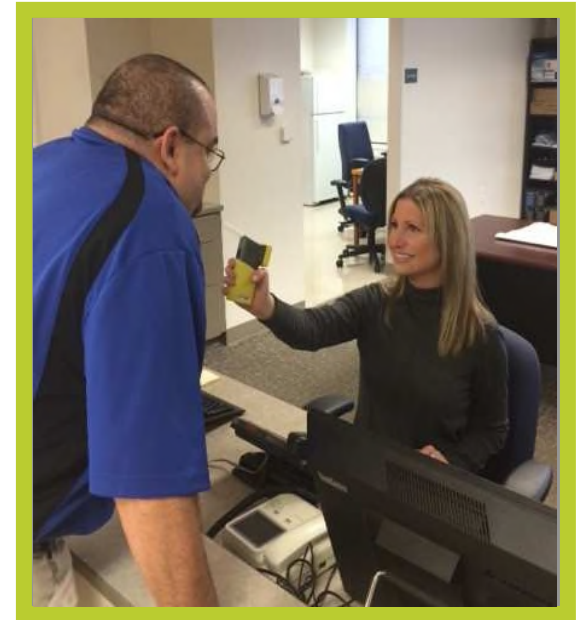
**Saliva Drug Rapid Test:**  
If you are on a Primary Drug Testing Protocol, you will be tested at the 24/7 program site randomly once or twice per week with results available immediately. You will call daily to see if you are required to report to testing that day.

**Drug Sweat Patch:**  
This is a patch which is placed on the skin and worn 1-2 weeks and sent in for analysis which will be available in 1-3 days. If you are tested on this protocol you will wear 1-2 patches per month.

# DOUGLAS COUNTY 24/7 SOBRIETY PROGRAM

## Participant Information

## What is 24/7 Sobriety?

The 24/7 Sobriety Program has one main goal and that is sobriety 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Some participants are here for Preliminary Breath Testing (PBT) and others are using the Secure Continuous Remote Alcohol Monitoring (SCRAM) Bracelet.

### 24/7 Test Site Guidelines:

- Be respectful to all 24/7 staff, participants, and the building.
- Be courteous when you park. Only park in legal parking spaces in the East lot and along the street.
- DO NOT leave any children under the age of 10 unattended in your vehicle. If it is necessary to bring your children when testing, they must accompany you into the 24/7 office.
- When you enter the building to test, you may not be using any electronic devices.

### In Case of Severe Weather...

- For any announcements regarding weather-related closures, please call (402)599-2518 and listen to the recorded message on our voicemail.
- 24/7 Program weather-related closures can also be found on all local TV channels. It will be listed as "Douglas County 24/7 Program."
- If you have provided us with your email address, we will notify you of any weather-related closures through email.



### How Does This Work?

Report to the 24/7 site and wait for the next available technician. Follow the procedure for your testing requirements.

#### PBT Clients:

- Print and sign your name on the sign-in sheet.
- Pay your \$2.00 testing fee.
- The 24/7 technician will place a new tube on the FST device.
- Blow out, slow and steady for six (6) seconds until the device "clicks" or the 24/7 technician says you can stop.
- Wait for your results.
- If you blow negative, you are free to leave.
- If you test positive, you must sit down for 15 minutes to wait for a second confirmatory test.

#### SCRAM Clients:

- Once the 24/7 Administrator has approved you for the SCRAM Program, installation of your SCRAMxBracelet will take place. It is the sole discretion of the 24/7 Administrator to offer SCRAM. As a rule, the first option will always be PBT.
- If you are reporting in order to download your SCRAMx Bracelet, you will sit in a chair at the far end of the counter.
- Put the clip onto the bracelet.
- Swipe the magnet over the clip to begin the download.
- The 24/7 technician will tell you when your download is complete.

## Violations

### What Happens if I Test Positive?

- First failed PBT or positive SCRAM reading: you will be placed in jail for 12 hours.
- Second failed PBT or positive SCRAM reading: you will be placed in jail for 24 hours.
- Third failed PBT or positive SCRAM reading: you will be placed in jail until you appear before a judge.
- Any failed drug test will result in being held to appear before a judge.

### What Happens if I Miss a Test or Fail to Report?

- First and subsequent missed PBT: your bond will be revoked and you will be placed in jail until you appear before a judge.
- If you have an at home SCRAM and fail to report as directed: your bond will be revoked and you will immediately surrender to law enforcement to be placed in jail until you appear before a judge. If you fail to surrender as required, a warrant will be issued, you will be arrested, and you will be placed in jail until you appear before a judge.
